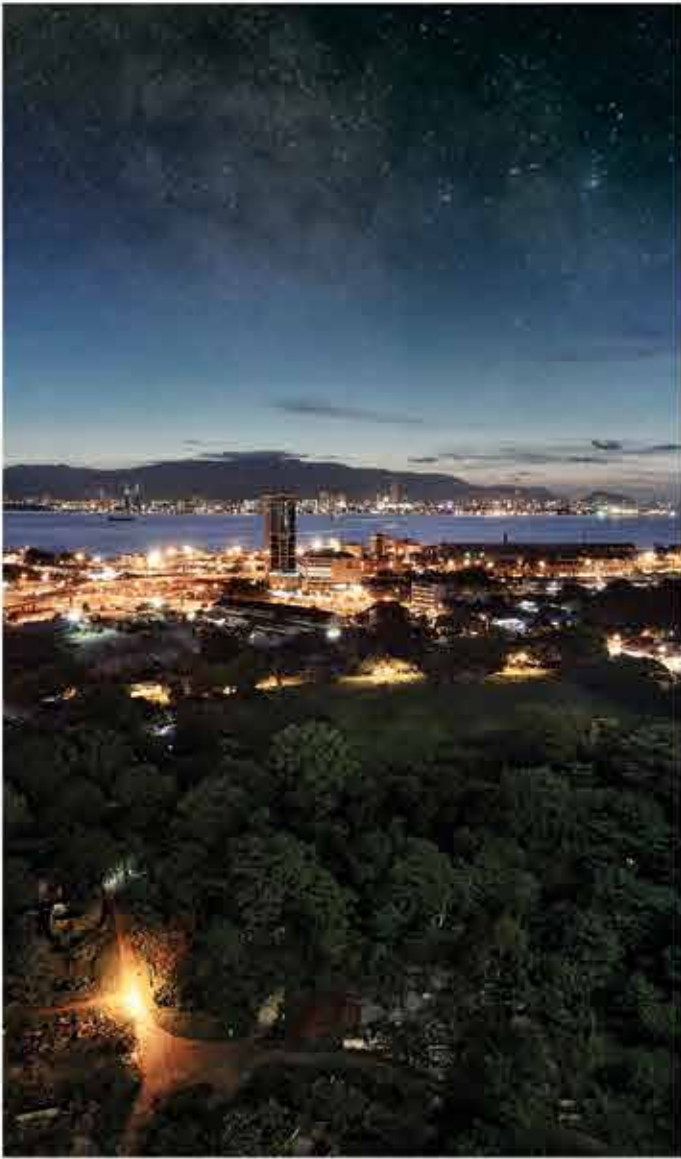


INTRODUCTION



When tourists describe Penang, they usually talk about the street art in George Town, the hawker stalls on crowded city streets, or the beaches by Batu Ferringhi. To many, Penang is just the island city on the northwest coast of Peninsular Malaysia. However, Penang island is only slightly more than a third of the state of Penang. Penang consists of the 285km² island connected by bridge to the mainland to another 760km² of land known as Seberang Perai. The main town is Butterworth, followed by other towns – Bukit Mertajam and Nibong Tebal. Here are some of the places you can visit on the other side of Penang.

RECREATION

JURU AUTO CITY

Reputed to be the first of its kind in Malaysia, Juru Auto City is a one-stop destination for auto, food, entertainment and shopping. It offers a myriad of great dining choices, auto brands and entertainment outlets – ideal for casual meetings and socialising.

DESIGN VILLAGE

The greenest mall in Malaysia and the only outlet mall in the Northern region. Design Village boasts an impressive outdoor shopping concept featuring a large variety of sportswear, iconic fashion and accessory brands plus food and beverage outlets.

IKEA

World-famous Swedish founded furniture brand IKEA is finally open in Penang and it is Malaysia's first store to be opened in the northern region. Drop by to scout for some furniture, interior design inspiration, or simply try their famous Swedish meatballs!

ICON CITY

Looking for somewhere to eat? Head over to Icon City, a commercial development occupied by cafés and restaurants, a luxury hotel, and other commercial outlets. Icon City is located just a short distance from Auto City where visitors and foodies are spoilt for choice.

MOUNTAIN VIEW GOLF RESORT

Swing away your clubs at Seberang Perai's Mountain View Golf Resort. Golfers can enjoy the scenic environment and peaceful ambience whilst honing their skills at this challenging 18-hole course.

BUKIT JAWI GOLF RESORT

Explore the formidable fairways and world-class golf courses in Sungai Bakap. Surrounded by jungle and lush greenery, golfers can expect a great challenge in their game.

PENANG GOLF RESORT

Penang Golf Resort is ideally nestled within the developed township of Bertam. The ecstatically beautiful golf resort offers a 36-hole golf course for members and non-members.

ROPE WALK, TAMAN SELAT

Similar to the concept of a flea market, this is the place where you can find antique goods such as old coins, watches and even irons. Besides that, this Rope Walk offers various ancillary trade goods such as clothing and local foods.

KAMPUNG AGONG

Highly rated by netizens on social media, the Homestay Kampung Agong is a scenic site to book a night's stay. It boasts an Instagram worthy kampung-style location with traditional wooden houses overlooking paddy fields and coconut trees. For an entrance fee of RM5, visitors can walk or cycle around and make use of the unique photo opportunities such as the giant bird-nest swings.

NIBONG TEBAL FIREFLY JETTY

Witness the fascinating flickering lights of fireflies by boat along the serene Sungai Kerian when night falls.

PULAU AMAN

A small, lesser known island lies off the coast of Penang, named as the Island of Peace. Home to a small community, Pulau Aman is an idyllic Malay fishing village just a short ferry ride from the Batu Musang jetty in Batu Kawan.

TAMAN NEGERI BUKIT PANCHOR

This protected forest is located in Nibong Tebal and covers an area of 445 hectares. Visitors can enjoy great family time at the man-made park and recreational area.

TAMAN TUNKU

Named after our country's first prime minister, Tunku Abdul Rahman, Taman Tunku is one of Butterworth's best recreational areas making it the perfect spot for evening jogs surrounded by lush greenery.

CENTRAL ISLAND PARK, BATU KAWAN

A magical garden filled with plenty of instagrammable moments – Central Island Park at Aspen Vision City in Batu Kawan showcases an artistic display of enchanting fountains and garden pathways that look amazing in daylight and even better at night.

REKREASI AIR HITAM DALAM

Relax your mind and learn about the mangrove forest in Penang. The recreational park covers 11 hectares of mangrove forest and showcases spectacular flora and fauna. Visitors can enjoy the surroundings while walking on the suspension bridge, viewing deck and more.

PENANG BIRD PARK

Home to over 300 bird species, explore Penang Bird Park that showcases about 2,500 birds. Visitors can interact with the birds during live shows and even catch a glimpse of pythons and crocodiles found in the park.

TAMAN RIMBA BUKIT MERTAJAM

A tropical forest perfect for hiking, picnicking and water dipping, Bukit Mertajam Recreational Forest is a relaxing spot amidst nature to spend time with loved ones. For an extra challenge, try to find the giant tree with roots equal to the height of two adults!

ST. ANNE'S CHURCH

St. Anne's Church Bukit Mertajam has existed since 1833 when the Chinese and Indian Catholics from Batu Kawan settled in the foothills of Bukit Mertajam. These people were farmers who had come to clear the land for cultivation. It was the very first Catholic Church built on top of the hill in Bukit Mertajam between 1840 and 1860. Today, tens of thousands of people through the grounds of St. Anne's Church to attend its grand 10-day festival held annually in July.

CHURCH OF ST. ANTHONY

This Roman Catholic Church in Nibong Tebal was founded in 1891 by a Catholic missionary, Father Rene Michel Marie Fee. The Church is dedicated to St. Anthony of Padua, Italy. It is one of the oldest churches in Penang.

MASJID ABDULLAH FAHIM KEPALA BATAS PULAU PINANG

Masjid Abdullah Fahim is one of the prominent landmarks of Kepala Batas. Beautifully located in Bertam, the mosque was mooted by the Honourable 5th Prime Minister, Tun Abdullah bin Ahmad Badawi and was completed on 28 September 2012.

MASJID TUAN SAMAD PERMATANG SUNGAI DUA

Tuan Samad, a religious teacher who lived in Permatang Sungai Dua built this mosque in the 1930s. The original structure was built using wood while the pillars and the floor were made of limestone.

MASJID JAMEK HAJI ABDUL RASHID SUNGAI DUA

Masjid Jamek Haji Abdul Rashid Sungai Dua is noted for its fine wood carvings of floral motif which adorn its windows. According to the local people, the mosque already existed in the 1950s.

SURAU KUBANG SEMANG

Surau Kubang Semang is located in the central zone of Seberang Perai. The design of the surau resembles a traditional Malay house. The surau is used only during the month of Ramadan (the Muslim month of fasting) for nightly Tarawih prayers.

SRI MUNISWARAR TEMPLE

Sri Muniswarar Temple is one of the oldest temples in Malaysia, established in the 1870s. This temple is famous for blessing newly purchased cars, even attracting many non-Hindus to have their cars blessed by the priest.

SRI SRI RADHA KRISHNA TEMPLE OF DEVOTION & UNDERSTANDING

This unique and impressive three-storey octagonal-shaped temple boasts 16 ornate pavilions with three main North Indian style towers and two glass skylight pyramidal domes. Opened in August 2015, the temple is touted as the grandest Krishna temple in the country.

NINE EMPEROR GODS TEMPLE (TOW BOO KONG TEMPLE)

The Nine Emperor Gods Temple is one of the largest temples in Butterworth. Dedicated to the Nine Emperor Gods of Taoist mores, it has gone through several makeovers over the years. It started out as a shrine on a rented plot of land in 1971. The current temple with magnificent architecture was completed in year 2000, at a cost of RM7 million.

KU ZHENG TSE TEMPLE

Ku Zheng Tse Temple is a newly built Buddhist temple in Seberang Jaya. The grand architecture of the temple emits an image of a Central Thai Temple. In the temple, there is a pavilion with donation tablets for the Gods and a huge shrine hall for devotees to pay their respects.

PERKAMPUNGAN SUNGAI LEMBU

Discover the life of a quaint villager at the homestay in Sungai Lembu. Visitors get to experience first-hand how villagers perform their daily activities such as farming.

ARULMIGU KARUMARIAMMAN TEMPLE

This temple is a South Indian Hindu temple located next to the Penang Bird Park. Built in 1977, it has the largest and tallest main sculpture tower (rajagopuram) in Malaysia, standing at an impressive height of 72 feet.

PASAR BISIK KUALA MUDA

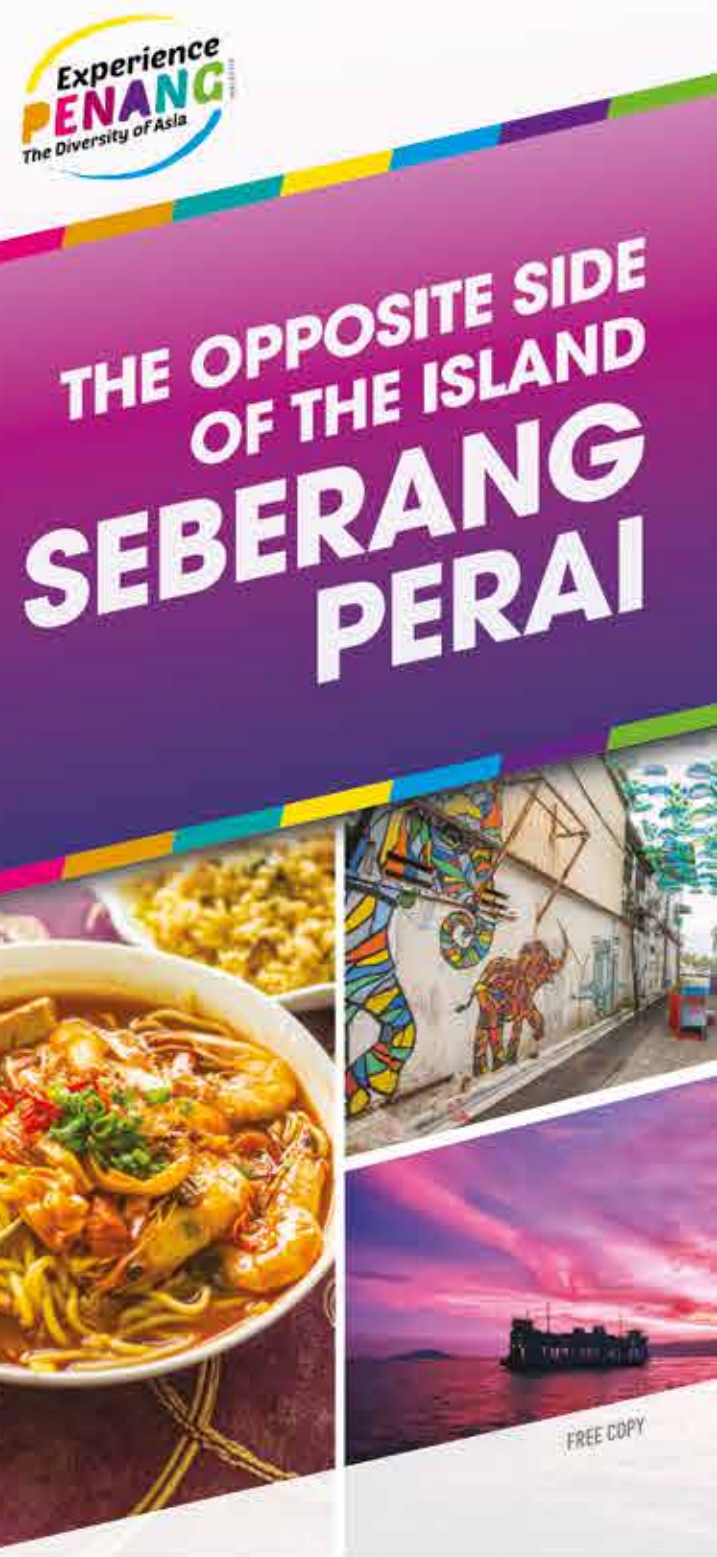
Kuala Muda is a place for fishermen to dock their boats. Located here is the famous Pasar Bisik (Whispering Market) where buyers traditionally make their auction bids by whispering their offers to sellers. It is a central trading point for fishermen and fishmongers from the surrounding areas including Kedah and Perak.

CAPAL JAGO KEPALA BATAS

Capal Jago is a famous leather sandals manufacturer in Kepala Batas of Seberang Perai, reputed to have made the 1st genuine handmade leather sandals. For the past 50 years, the sandals have been branded as JAGO.

TUKANG BESI, PERMATANG BENUAN

Since 1841, the blacksmiths of Permatang Benuan have been one of the oldest steel equipment manufacturers in Malaysia. They are the only manufacturers of traditional Malay weapons, famous not only in Penang but throughout northern Peninsular Malaysia.

HISTORY



MAKAM KERABAT DIRAJA KEDAH

The Kedah Royal Mausoleum is part of Kedah's Malay Sultanate heritage. This mausoleum was founded by Almarhum Tunku Sulaiman Ilni Almarhum Sultan Abdullah Mukarram Shah before 1821. On 12 November 1821, Armada Siam from Ligur invaded and conquered Kedah. Sultan Ahmad Tajuddin Halim Shah II, the Sultan of Kedah at the time, fled from his house in Pulau Tiga to this area and was rescued by his younger brother Tunku Sulaiman before seeking protection from the British in Penang. This area has been designated as an endowment land by the British.

BATU BERSURAT CHEROK TOKUN

Batu Bersurat CheroK Tokun is one of our national treasures. This stone with ancient inscriptions was founded by Colonel James Low in 1845, and gazetted as a national heritage site under the National Heritage Act 2005. To preserve the stone as a historical monument, a shelter was built over it. Under the care of the Penang Museum, it is preserved in the grounds of St. Anne's Church near CheroK Tokun hill in Bukit Mertajam.

DATARAN PEMUDA MERDEKA BUTTERWORTH

Dataran Pemuda Merdeka Butterworth, originally known as British Recreation Club (BRC), is close to the locals' heart. The place recorded various historical and nostalgic events where the struggle for independence started.

UMAH TUAN GURU HAJI OTHMAN

Kubang Ulu in the district of Seberang Perai Tengah boasts a heritage building reminiscent of houses in Mecca. It belonged to Tuan Guru Haji Othman, a famous religious teacher during the 1900s. This triple-storey house is more than 100 years old and is presently occupied by the 3rd generation of his descendants.

BATU SEMPADAN BRITISH SIAM PINANG TUNGGAL

The British-Siamese Boundary Stone located in a remote field at Pinang Tunggul North Seberang Perai was built to mark the boundary and the signing of a treaty between the two territories of the British colony and the Siamese Kingdom in 1869. At that time, Penang was under the British administration while Kedah was under the ruling of the Siamese.

BUTTERWORTH ART WALK

KERETAPI TANAH MELAYU (KTM)

Bukit Mertajam Railway Station is a train station in the town of Bukit Mertajam. Although it was first built in the early 20th century, it has been renovated a number of times. It is the last station for trains from the south before they pull into the Butterworth Railway Station.

JAMBATAN MERDEKA BUMBONG LIMA

Jambatan Merdeka is located on the border of Kedah / Penang. The bridge was completed in 1957 to replace the original bridge built in 1940 that was destroyed by the Japanese Army in 1942. The bridge crosses the Sungai Muda river and connects the states of Kedah and Seberang Perai, Penang. It was officiated by Yang Teramat Mulia Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj (the 1st Prime Minister of Malaysia) and was named 'Jambatan Merdeka' (Bridge of Independence).



PENANG BRIDGE

Built in 1985, Penang Bridge is an icon of the Penang State connecting Seberang Perai and Penang Island. With a length of 13.5km, the bridge is the second longest in Malaysia, compared to Penang's other connecting bridge to Seberang Perai at 24km, the longest in Southeast Asia.

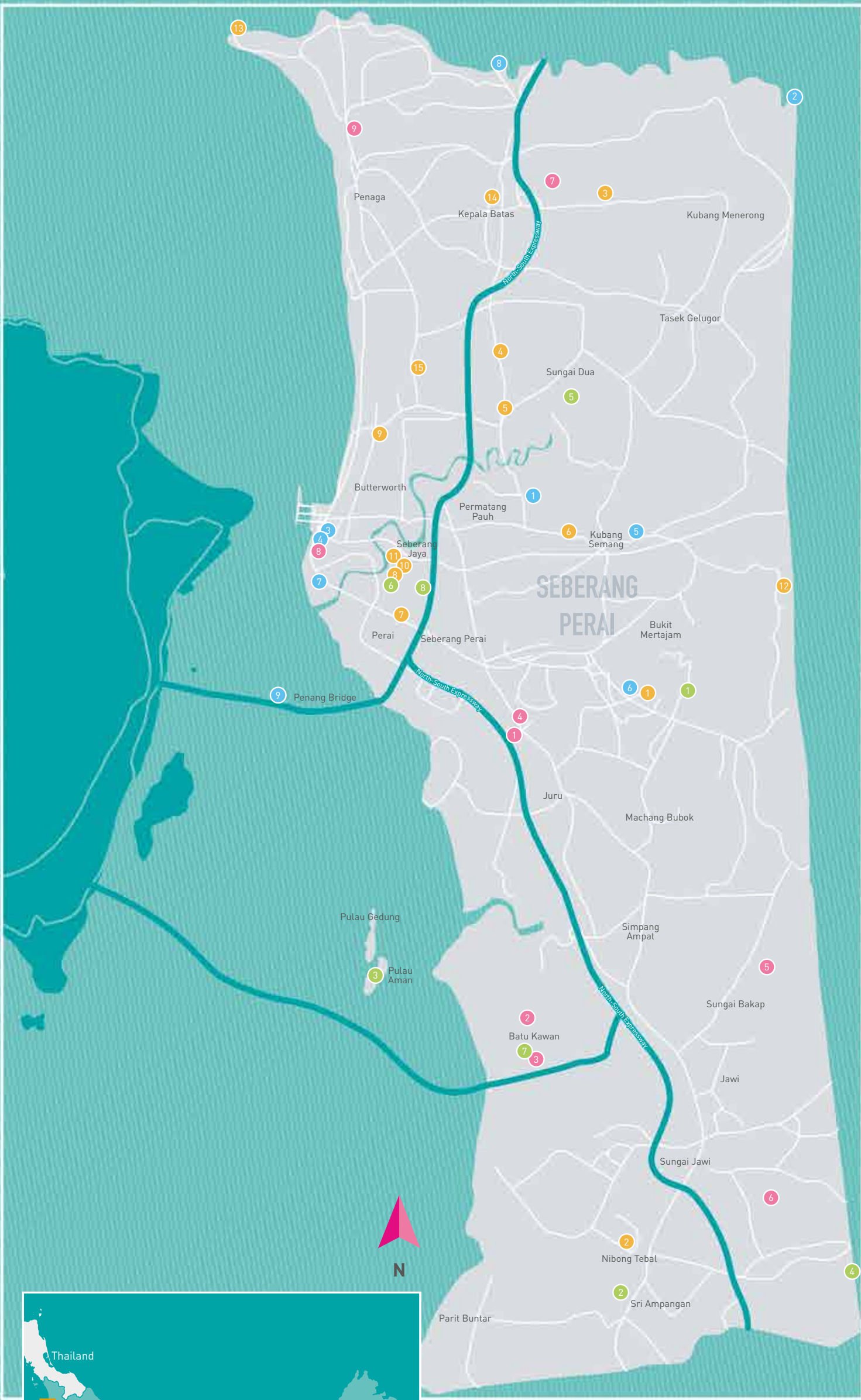
